Objective

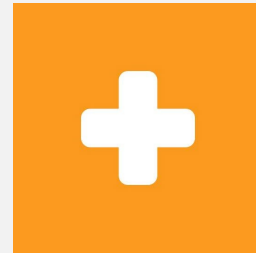
