
Humans & The Extinction Crisis Human Population (millions)









Our World

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The idea that parenthood and raising children should be the central focus of every person's adult life. It is a strong social force and includes a collection of beliefs so embedded that they have come to be seen as true





The pains, the dangers, and risks of childbearing are tabooed as subjects of conversation. The drudgery, the monotonous labor, and other disagreeable features of child-rearing are minimized by 'the social guardians.' On the other hand, the joys and compensations of motherhood are magnified and presented to consciousness on every hand. Thus the tendency is to create an illusion whereby motherhood will appear to consist of compensations only, and thus come to be desired by those for whom the illusion is intended.


And even though ambivalence is a feeling that may accompany each and every one of our human relationships, there is only one answer society tolerates from mothers to the question of motherhood: "I love it."








Pronatalism is especially disempowering for girls, because from a young age they're groomed for marriage and motherhood, and can never even come to think of motherhood as choice, and this robs them of their ability to fully live out their authentic selves.










For young women, especially for women who haven't had children, it's very hard to get a sterilization procedure, in large part, because of the assumption that every woman will want a child. Doctors have a serious reluctance to get in the middle of that. So, that's another aspect of reproductive rights that we don't even talk about—the right to get permanent contraception.





The 'biological clock' that some women claim to hear ticking is also a 'social clock' reminding them that whatever else may be going on in their lives, motherhood is their destiny, the road to social acceptance and integration.









Yet, this state of affairs is so taken for granted that it is almost invisible, and is therefore especially hard to eradicate. Attempts to do so (antipronatalism) are also often erroneously confused with, and undermined by, negativism about having children (anti-natalism).
















Pronatalism's chief characteristic - and its moral Achilles heel - is that it undermines autonomous decision-making about childbearing.



Social Justice


We challenge unjust and growth-driven cultural, political, and economic systems that exploit marginalized human communities and threaten all life on earth.
